1. Getting Started

1.1 Installing the Batteries

Your device is powered by 2 AAA batteries (included).

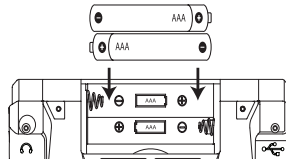
1. Turn the unit off and turn it over.
2. Open the battery cover on the back of the unit by pushing in the direction of the arrow.
3. Install the batteries following the +/- markings in the battery compartment.

Important: Be sure that the batteries are installed correctly. Wrong polarity may damage the unit.

4. Replace the battery cover.

Note: Replace the batteries when you see an alert on the screen.

Warning! If the batteries wear out completely, or if you take more than a few seconds while changing the batteries, any user entered information may be erased. You should always keep written copies of your important information.



Battery Precautions

- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged. Never recharge batteries that come with the device.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the device before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickle-cadmium) batteries.
- Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Do not expose batteries to direct heat or try to take batteries apart. Follow the battery manufacturer's instructions for battery use.
- Always remove a weak or dead battery from the device.
- To avoid damage caused by leakage of the battery fluid, replace the battery or batteries once every two years regardless of how much the device has been used during that time.
- Should a battery leak, the device may become damaged. Clean the battery compartment immediately, avoiding contact with your skin.
- Keep batteries out of reach of small children. If swallowed, consult a physician immediately.

1.2 Switching On and Off

Press to switch on or off the device. The device is also equipped with a display backlight for using in the dark, hold and press to switch it on or off.

1.3 Setting the Message Language

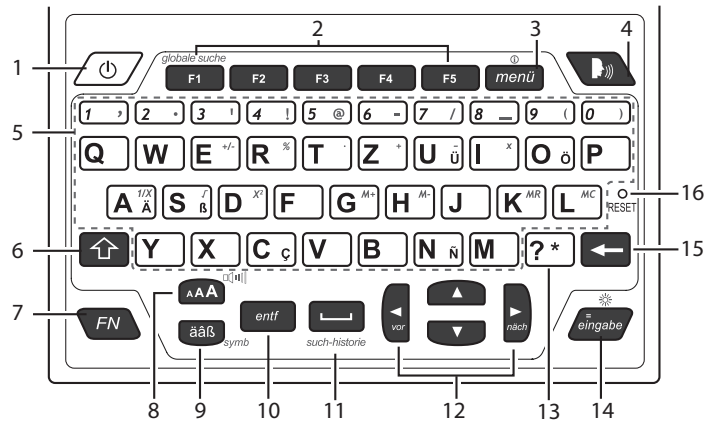
The first time you use this device, you are prompted to select a message language. Press the letter key (or / and then) for the language you want. Message language is the language of all menu items and messages in your device. To change the message language, see 7.1 *Changing the Settings*.

1.4 Using the Main Menu

Press to access the main menu at any screens to quickly take you to different books and exercises in your device. The main menu contains five tabs: *Books*, *Learn*, *Exercises*, *Games* and *Tools*. Use / to move to another tab. Use / to select the option you want and press . You can also go directly to a tab by pressing the tab's respective Soft Key.



1.5 Key Guide



- Turns on or off.
- Soft Keys - Press **FN** - **F5** that corresponds to the function label at the bottom of the screen.
- Goes to the main menu.
- Speaks a word or phrase (if a pronunciation is available).
- Input letters, numbers and symbols.
- Shifts to type capital letters.
- Performs additional functions in combination with other keys.
- Changes the size of screen type.
- Selects accents for characters.
- Clears all entries or cancels the current operation and reverts back to the last working prompt, screen or menu.
- Types a space.
- Direction keys - Moves up (▲), down (▼), left (◀) or right (▶). The arrows on the right of the screen show which Direction keys you can press to move around menus or view more text.
- At a word entry screen, types a “?” to stand for an unknown letter in a word.
- Enters a word, selects an item, submits a response or begins selection mode in an entry.

- Backs up, erases a letter, or turns off selection mode in an entry.
- Reset key

Combination Keys

More functions are available by combining keys.

Key 1 + Key 2 means hold **Key 1** while also pressing **Key 2**.

FN + ▲/▼ Scrolls up or down one screen at a time.

FN + ◀/▶ Goes to the previous or next entry.

FN + ▲/▼ Jumps to top or bottom of entries.

FN + 0-9 Types the special characters shown on the number keys.

FN + ääß Shows the symbol menu for typing a symbol.

FN + menü Displays help instructions.

FN + ?* At a word entry screen, types an asterisk (*) to stand for any series of unknown letters or characters in a word.

FN + AAA Shows the volume control menu.

FN + eingabe Turns on or off the screen backlight.

FN + such-historie Shows the search history.

FN + F1 Jumps to Global Search.

3. BOOKS menu

3.1 Using Global Search

Global Search allows searching for all words and phrases saved in the device. You can use multiple words for searching.

1. In the **Books** menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select **Global Search** and then press .

Or, press  + .

2. **Type a word.**

See 3.6 *Hints on Inputting Words*.


With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press ▲ / ▼ to select another word entry you see in the word list.

The source* of each entry is indicated in the word list.


*D-/E-/D = German-English Dictionary; D-/F-/D = German-French Dictionary; D-/I-/D = German-Italian Dictionary; D-/S-/D = German-Spanish Dictionary; DU = Duden German Spelling Dictionary; E-E OX = Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary; E-E OL = Oxford Learner's Thesaurus


Press **DEF** to preview the entries while you are browsing the word list. Press **HIDE** to cancel this function.


3. **Press** .

If there are multiple forms within an entry, press ▲ or ▼ to select the one you want and then press .

4. **Press** ▲ / ▼ to scroll up or down one line at a time.

Press  + ▲ / ▼ to scroll up or down one screen at a time.

Press  + ◀ / ▶ to go to the previous or next entry in the dictionary.

Press  to hear the headword pronounced (if pronunciation is available).

See 3.7 *Using the Soft Key* for more information on the soft keys.

5. **Press** to start a new search.

✓ Refining Your Search

Use the following soft keys.

SOURCE: Limits the search within the selected source language. The source language is the language in which you enter words for searching.

TARGET: Limits the search within the selected target language. The target language is the language in which you wish to view the definition or translation.

IDIOM: Goes to English idiom search.

EXAMPLE: Goes to usage example search.

3.2 Using the Dictionaries

The following instructions apply to the dictionaries in the *Books* menu. **Note:** The functions described below may not be available to all dictionaries or at all times.


1. In the **Books** menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select a dictionary and then press .

2. **Type a word.**

See 3.6 *Hints on Inputting Words*.


To refine your search, press ▲ / ▼ to select *Word Search*, *Example Search*, *Idiom Search* or *Collocation Search* (if available) before you start to type.

With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press ▲ / ▼ to select another word entry you see in the word list.


In the four bilingual dictionaries, press  to switch between the source and target languages.


Press **DEF** to preview the entries while you are browsing the word list. Press **HIDE** to cancel this function.


3. **Press** .

If there are multiple forms within an entry, press ▲ or ▼ to select the one you want and then press .

4. **Press** ▲ / ▼ to scroll up or down one line at a time.


Press  + ▲ / ▼ to scroll up or down one screen at a time.

Press  + ◀ / ▶ to go to the previous or next entry in a dictionary or in a list of multiple search results.

Press  to hear the headword pronounced (if pronunciation is available).

5. **Press** to start a new search.

3.3 Misspelling Words

If the letters you type do not find a match in the list, your word is misspelled or not in the dictionaries. A list of possible spelling corrections is displayed. Press ▲ / ▼ to select the entry you want and then press . This feature is not available to Global Search.

3.4 Uncertain Spellings

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type the portion of the word you do know, and type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. Type an asterisk (*)

to stand for any missing portion of a word, including prefixes, suffixes, spaces, symbols, or any number of letters.


3.5 Inflections/Conjugations


Inflected Form Searching

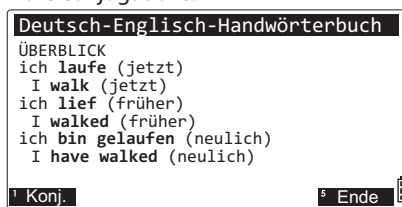
The device is equipped with a smart system to retrieve results from an inflected word. For example, when you type “ate”, the device will retrieve results from the word “eat”. For a word with multiple parts of speech (e.g. the word “record” is both a noun and a verb), both definitions will show.

Looking Up Inflections

To look up inflections in the *German-English*, *Duden German Spelling* and the *Oxford dictionaries*, press **CONJ** (when inflections are available to a word).

In the German-English dictionary, some words may have multiple parts of speech or translations, press ▲ / ▼ to select the one you want and then press  to view the inflections.

For verbs, press **CONJ** or  + ◀ / ▶ to view more conjugations.



To look up inflections in the *German-French*, *Italian* and *Spanish* dictionaries:

1. After looking up the translation of a word, press .

For example, in the German-French dictionary, the French translation of the word “essen” is “manger”.

2. Use the direction keys to highlight the translated word and press .








In the above example, highlight the word “manger”.

3. **Press** **CONJ**.



For verbs, press **CONJ** or  + ◀ / ▶ to view more conjugations.

3.6 Hints on Inputting Words

The following instructions apply to all entry screens where word input is allowed. **Note:** Some entry screens may allow only certain types of character inputs.

- Hold  and press a letter key to type a capital letter.
- To type accents, type a letter (e.g., e) and then press  until the accent you want appears (e.g., é).
- Press  to delete the letter to the left of the cursor.
- To type a number, press a number key.
- To type a special character shown on a number key, hold  and then press a number key.
- To type other symbols, press  + . Use the direction keys to select the symbol you want from the pop-up menu and then press .

3.7 Using the Soft Keys

Soft key functions are represented by the labels displayed along the bottom of the screen. These labels change to reflect the various functions available in different features of the device. Press  -  that corresponds to the label.


CLOSE: Closes the current screen.

CONF: Views the confusables (such as homonyms, homophones and spelling variants) related to the current word entry.

CONJ: Shows inflections/conjugations. See 3.5 *Inflections/Conjugations*.

DICT: Goes to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary or an indicated dictionary.

DEF: Enables the preview feature.

EXAMPLE: Views usage examples of current entry. Press ▲ / ▼ to select the example you want and then press .

GLOBAL: Goes to Global Search.

HIDE: Cancels the preview feature.


HINT: Shows additional information of a dictionary.

LIST: Goes to My Word List or adds the current entry to My Word List. See 4.1 *My Word List* for details.

NEXT: Goes to the next entry.

PREV: Goes to the previous entry.

PREVON: Previews the current entry.

RANGE: Refines search by multiple words. Press ▲ / ▼ to select an option from the pop-up menu and then press .

All = Look for entries with the search words, whenever they appear.

Items following specified order = Look for entries with the search words, in the order as

you typed.












Input words are in successions = Look for entries with the search words, in the word successions as you typed.

THES: Goes to the Oxford Learner's Thesaurus.

↔: Switches between the source and target languages.

3.8 Highlighting Words

Another way to look up words in the dictionaries is by highlighting them in an entry. **Note:** this feature may not be available on all screens.








1. **At a text screen supporting word selection, press .**
If the first word on the screen is highlighted, this feature is supported.
2. **Press , ,  or  to select an available word you want to learn and press .**
If the selected word has entries in multiple dictionaries, a pop-up window will show. Press  /  to select the dictionary you want and press .
3. **When done, press  to return to the original dictionary.**
4. **Press  to turn off the highlight.**

4. LEARN menu

4.1 My Word List

As you explore new words, save them in the *My Word List* for further study or review.

Adding Words Directly





1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *My Word List* and press .**
2. **Press  /  to select a language version and then press .**
3. **Press **ADD**. Type a word and then press **FIND** or .**

If the word to be added can be found in more than one dictionary, the dictionary from which the word was saved is indicated in the list by an abbreviation*.











4. **Press  /  to select the dictionary you want and then press **SAVE** or  to add the word to the list.**

Adding Words from a Dictionary

1. **In a dictionary, type a word you want to look up and add to the word list.**
2. **Press **LIST**.**
Add "word" to word list?, Go to My Word List, and Cancel appear in a menu.
3. **Press  /  to make a selection, and press .**
A message will confirm your entry was added.
You can also press  to view the dictionary entry and then press **LIST** to see your options.

Viewing Word Lists

1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *My Word List* and press .**
2. **Press  /  to select a language version and then press .**
3. **Press  /  to select an entry.**
You can also type in the "Find:" field to look for a word.
4. **Press .**
5. **Press  to return to the Word List.**
6. **Press **CLOSE** to exit the Word List.**

✓ Editing Word Lists

Use the following soft keys.

DELETE: To delete the selected word from the list.







DEL ALL: To erase the entire word list.

In either case, you are asked to confirm your selection, press **Y** to do so or **N** to cancel.

4.2 Personal Dictionaries

Use the Personal Dictionary feature to create your own dictionaries on the device. You can copy them to your PC for further editing.

Creating Dictionaries on the Device

1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *Personal Dictionary* and then press .**
2. **Press **NEW** to create a new personal dictionary.**
3. **Type a name for the dictionary and then press .**
4. **Input a word and its definition in the appropriate field and then press **SAVE**.**
See 3.6 *Hints on Inputting Words*.
Press  or  to advance to the next field.
Press ↔ to change the input language.










To quit without saving, press **CLOSE**, then press **Y** to confirm the exit.

5. **Press **ADD** to add more words to the dictionary.**
Repeat steps 4-5 to add more words to the dictionary.

Editing Personal Dictionaries on Your PC

1. **Connect the device to your PC.**
See 9.1 *Connecting to a PC*.
2. **Double-click "PersonalDict" to open that folder.**
3. **In the folder, double-click to open a personal dictionary file (.txt) with a text editor.**
4. **Edit or add new words.**
Each new word must start on a new line. Separate the headword and its definition with a tab. Press "Enter" after entering the definition, including the last line.
5. **Save the file and disconnect the device from your PC.**

Viewing Personal Dictionaries

1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *Personal Dictionary* and then press .**
2. **Press  /  in the dictionary selection screen to select the one you want and then press .**
3. **Press  /  to select the entry you want to view and press .**
You can also type in the "Find:" field to look for a word.

✓ Editing Personal Dictionaries

Use the following soft keys.




DELETE: To delete the currently selected dictionary or word entry.

DEL ALL: To erase all personal dictionaries. In either case, you are asked to confirm your selection, press **Y** to do so or **N** to cancel.










EDIT: Press this key when viewing an entry to make necessary changes and then press **SAVE**. To quit without saving, press **CLOSE**, then press **Y** to confirm the exit.

RENAME: To rename the dictionary.


4.3 Phrasebook

1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *Phrasebook* and then press .**
The phrases are grouped into several

categories in your selected message language.

















2. **Press  /  to select a category and press .**
3. **Press  /  to select a phrase you want to translate and press .**
If you want to show the phrases in another language, press **SOURCE** to select the language you want.
4. **Press **TARGET** to change the language for the translated phrases.**
5. **Press  to hear the first phrase listed on the screen. Press  to hear the second (translated) phrase.**
Press **PREV** or **NEXT** to view the previous or next phrase in the current category.
6. **Press  to return to the list of phrases.**

✓ Searching for a Phrase

Instead of browsing through the phrases, you can press **SEARCH** and type a keyword in the "Find:" field and then press  to yield phrase(s) with the keyword. If your search returns no matches, try other forms of the word, including the root word, if you have typed the inflected form. **Note:** Accents must be typed to deliver matches. See 3.6 *Hints on Inputting Words*.

4.4 Grammar Guides

Your device includes essential grammar lessons with quizzes. All guides are written in German.

1. **In the *Learn* menu, press  /  to select *Grammar Guides in German* and then press .**
2. **Press  /  to select a language and then press .**
3. **Press  /  to select the topic you want to study and then press .**
Repeat this step if there are sub-topics until you read the content.
Press  +  /  to scroll up or down one screen at a time.
4. **Press  +  /  to view the previous or next topic.**
5. **Press  to go to the list of topics or **MAIN** to go to main menu of grammar guides.**

✓ Quizzes

Many sections in the grammar guide include a quiz. Press **QUIZ** to go to the quiz. If a topic contains multiple quizzes, you will see more than one **QUIZ** soft key.

After the quiz, press **CLOSE** to return to the topic you were reading.

4.5 Finding Idioms and Usage Examples

Your device can locate English idioms and usage examples and their translation. You can use multiple words for searching.

1. In the **Learn** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **Usage Examples or Idiom Search** and then press **eingabe**.

2. For the search of usage examples, press **SOURCE** and then **▲ / ▼** to select a language for your search results. Confirm your choice with **eingabe**.

Select **ALL** to show results in all languages.

3. Press **RANGE** and then **▲ / ▼** to select a multiple word search option. Confirm your choice with **eingabe**.

All = Look for entries with the search words, whenever they appear.

Items following specified order = Look for entries with the search words, in the order as you typed.

Input words are in successions = Look for entries with the search words, in the word successions as you typed.

4. **Type a word.**

With each letter you type, the resulting list of potential matching entries is refreshed. If the letters you typed match an entry in the word list, it is automatically highlighted. Or, press **▲ / ▼** to select another word entry you see in the word list.

5. Press **eingabe**.

If there are multiple results within an entry, press **▲** or **▼** to select the one you want and then press **eingabe**.

Press **DICT** to look up the entry of the original keyword in the dictionary.

6. Press **entf** to start a new search.

4.6 Search History

The device stores the most recently browsed entries in dictionaries.

1. In the **Learn** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **History** and then press **eingabe**.

As a shortcut, press **FN** + **↵**.

2. Press **▲ / ▼** to select an entry and then press **eingabe**.

✓ Editing History

Use the following soft keys.

DELETE: To delete the selected entry.

DEL ALL: To clear the entire history.

In either case, you are asked to confirm your selection, press **Y** to do so or **N** to cancel.

5. EXERCISE menu

5.1 Picture Card Game

1. In the **Exer** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **Picture Card Game** and then press **eingabe**.

2. Press **START** to start the game.

You can change the language and skill level at this screen. Press **▲ / ▼** to select one of the settings. Press **▶** to show the options in a setting. Press **▲ / ▼** to select one of the options and then press **eingabe**.

3. A picture shows briefly followed by a list of word choices. Press **▲ / ▼** and then **eingabe** to select the word that matches with the picture.

4. The round ends when you select the correct word or when you press **QUIT**.

If you see the message, "Incorrect, try again," press **PIC** to see the picture again before making another attempt. Press **HINT** to eliminate an incorrect answer.

Press **SAY** to hear the game word pronounced.

Press **TRANS** to see the translation or definition of the highlighted word. In the translation, press **TARGET** to change the language.

Press **NEXT** to start a new round.

Press **QUIT** or **END** to end current round or exit the game.

5.2 Spelling Bee

1. In the **Exer** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select the **Spelling Bee language version you want** and then press **eingabe**.

Each version draws words from the corresponding *My Word List*. You should have several words entered in *My Word List* before the exercise.

2. A word is pronounced.

3. Type in the word you just heard and press **eingabe** to see if you spelled it correctly.

If you see the message, "Incorrect, try again," press **↵** to hear the word again before making another attempt to spell the word. Press **HINT** to show the word briefly on the screen.

4. The round ends when you enter the correct word or when you press **END**.

Press **LOOKUP** to see the translation or definition of the word. Press **↵** to return to the exercise.

5. Press **NEW** to hear a new word.

6. Press **END** to exit the exercise.

5.3 Flashcards

1. In the **Exer** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select the **Flashcards language version you want** and then press **eingabe**.

Each version draws words from the corresponding *My Word List*. You should have several words entered in *My Word List* before the exercise.

2. A word will be displayed on the screen for you to study, define, and translate.

3. If you can recite the definition or translation, press **NEW** to continue to the next word.

If not, press **LOOKUP**. Press **↵** to return to the exercise.

4. Press **END** to exit the exercise.

6. GAMES menu

6.1 Playing the Games

Changing Game Settings

1. In the **Games** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **Game Settings** and press **eingabe**.

2. Press **▲ / ▼** to select one of the settings. Press **▶** to show the options in a setting. Press **▲ / ▼** to select one of the options and then press **eingabe**.

Language determines the language for the games.

Skill level determines the level of difficulty.

Words determines the source from which the games draw words.

3. Press **↵** when done.

6.2 Selecting a Game

In the **Games** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select the game of your choice and press **eingabe**.

6.3 Game Instructions

During any game you can read instructions by pressing **FN** + **menu**. You can sometimes receive a hint by pressing **HINT**. Press **END** to give up and reveal the game word. Press **QUIT** to exit the game.

7. TOOLS menu

7.1 Changing the Settings

To adjust the basic settings at any time:

1. In the **Tools** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **Settings** and then press **eingabe**.

2. Press **▲ / ▼** to select one of the following settings:

Shutoff determines how long your device stays on if no key is pressed.

Contrast determines how dark or light the screen is.

Type size determines the size of screen type.

Learn a Word determines whether or not you be greeted with a word selected from a dictionary of your choice every time you turn on the device.

Message language determines the language for prompts, help, and messages.

Time setup allows you to set the clock.

3. Press **◀ / ▶** to select an option (except for **Message Language and Time Setup**).

4. Press **CLOSE** when done.

Setting the Time and Date

1. Press **▶** when *Time setup* is selected.

2. Press **▲ / ▼** to select the setting you want.

When *Date* or *Time* is selected, press **▶**, then press **◀ / ▶** to move between fields in the pop-up window. Press **▲ / ▼** to adjust the values. Press **eingabe** when done.

When *Date Format* or *Time Format* is selected, press **◀ / ▶** to select the desired date or time display style.

When *Home City* or *World City* is selected, press **▶**, then press **▲ / ▼** to select a city and press **eingabe**. You can also press a letter to go directly to that part of the list.

When *Home City DST* or *World City DST* is selected, press **◀ / ▶** to turn *Daylight Saving Time* on or off.

3. Press **↵** when done.

7.2 Using Phone Book, Schedule and Memo

Adding Entries

1. In the **Tools** menu, press **▲ / ▼** to select **Phone Book, Schedule or Memo** and then press **eingabe**.

2. Press **NEW**.

3. Enter the appropriate information in the available fields.

See 3.6 Hints on Inputting Words.

Press ▼ or **gingabe** to advance to the next field.

Press **↔** to change the input language.

In schedule or memo records, press ► when required to open a pop-up menu. In schedule records, this includes selecting the type of event, the time of the event and whether or not to set an alarm. In memos, this includes selecting a date. Use the navigation buttons to select your settings and then press **gingabe**.

4. When done, press SAVE.

To quit without saving, press **CLOSE**, then press **Y** to confirm the exit.

Viewing and Editing

For full instructions on viewing and editing the entries and using a password, press **FN** + **menü** in Phone book, Schedule or Memo.

7.3 Using Class Schedule

Adding Entries

1. In the *Tools* menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select *Class Schedule* and press **gingabe**.

2. Press ◀ / ▶ to select a day you want.

3. Press **EDIT**.

4. Press ▲ / ▼ to select a time slot you want.

5. Enter details in the time slot.

See 3.6 Hints on Inputting Words.

To add more details in a time slot, press **DETAILS** and then enter appropriate information in the available fields. Press **↔** to change the input language.

6. Press **SAVE** when done.

To quit without saving, press **CLOSE**, then press **Y** to confirm the exit.

Viewing and Editing

For full instructions on viewing and editing the time slots and using a password, press **FN** + **menü** in Class Schedule.

7.4 Using the Timer

The Timer is located in the *TOOLS* menu. It lets you set the day of an event and shows you how long it will be until that specific date. For full instructions on setting the timer, press **FN** + **menü** in Timer.

7.5 Using the Stopwatch

The Stopwatch is located in the *TOOLS* menu. It measures the amount of time elapsed from the time you activated the stopwatch. For full instructions on using the stopwatch, press **FN** + **menü** in Stopwatch.

7.6 Using the Clock

The clock displays both home and world times. You can also check the time in different cities around the world.

For full instructions on setting the clock, press **FN** + **menü** in Clock.

7.7 Using the Calculator

In the *Tools* menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select *Calculator* and then press **gingabe**.

To type number, use the number keys. To perform math functions, use the keys with mathematical signs printed on their top right corner. To erase the last typed number, press **←**. To perform an operation, press **gingabe**. To clear only the last operation, press **CE**. To clear all operations, press **AC** or **ontf**.

7.8 Using the Metric Converter

1. In the *Tools* menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select *Metric Converter* and then press **gingabe**.

2. Press ▲ / ▼ to select a conversion category and then press **gingabe**.

3. In the selected category, press ▲ / ▼ to select a measurement unit.

4. Enter the numbers for conversion.

Press **T** for a decimal. As you type the numbers, the equivalent value in other units shows automatically.

5. Press **ontf** or **NEW** to start a new conversion. Press **CLOSE** to exit.

7.9 Using the Currency Converter

1. In the *Tools* menu, press ▲ / ▼ to select *Currency Converter* and then press **gingabe**.

2. Press ▲ / ▼ to select a currency.

3. Enter the numbers for conversion.

Press **T** for a decimal. As you type the numbers, the equivalent value in other currencies shows automatically.

4. Press **ontf** or **NEW** to start a new conversion. Press **CLOSE** to exit.

Adjusting Exchange Rates

1. Press **SETUP**.

2. Press ▲ / ▼ to select an exchange rate you want to change.

3. Press **ontf** to clear the selected rate.

4. Enter a new exchange rate.

5. Press **SAVE**.

To quit without saving, press **CLOSE**, then press **Y** to confirm the exit. Press **DEFAULT** to reset all rates to default values.

8. General Controls

8.1 Headphone Jack

The headphone jack is located on the right of the device for 3.5 mm, 35 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution:** Monophonic headphones will not work with this unit.

8.2 USB Port

The USB port is located on the left of the device for a mini-USB 1.1 compatible connection. See 9.1 *Connecting to a PC*.

8.3 Adjusting Sound Volume

Press **FN** + **AAA** to show the volume control menu. Press ◀ / ▶ to adjust the volume and then press **←**.

8.4 Display Backlight

Press **FN** + **gingabe** to switch on or off the display backlight.

8.5 Changing Size of Screen Type

Press **AAA** repeatedly to change the size of the screen type.

8.6 Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing **FN** + **menü**. To exit help, press **←**.

8.7 Resetting Your Device

If the keyboard fails to respond, or if the screen performs erratically, use a paper clip to gently press the reset button located on your unit to reset your device.



Warning! Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently

disable your unit. In addition, resetting the unit erases settings and information you may have entered.

9. PC Connections

9.1 Connecting to a PC

1. Turn on your device.

2. Connect the wide end of a USB cable to a USB port on your PC and the smaller end to the USB port on your device.

You see a “Franklin connects” icon on the screen of your device when it is properly connected to your PC. The keyboard on your device is now disabled.

The first time you plug your device into your PC, software drivers may install. This happens automatically. When the drivers are installed your PC will let you know that your device is ready to use. A window may also be opened displaying the available folders on your device. If you need to find it, look for a drive labeled “FRANKLIN”.

9.2 Copying Files to Your Device

Your device is not limited to the books it comes with. You can transfer personal dictionaries. You can also save copies of your data to another location on your PC to backup important information.

Try copying a personal dictionary (.txt file) to your device:

1. Make sure your device is connected to your PC.

See 9.1 *Connecting to a PC*.

2. On your PC, use Windows Explorer to find the drive labelled “FRANKLIN” and double-click it to open it.

3. Double-click “PersonalDict” to open that folder.

4. Navigate on your PC to where you store .txt files.

5. Right-click the .txt file you want to copy to your device and then click “Copy” from the pop-up menu.

6. Right-click in the “PersonalDict” window and then click “Paste” from the pop-up menu.

7. Close the open folders.

8. Unplug the USB cable from your PC and the device.

9.3 About Your Device Folders

When you connect your device to your PC, you can see an assortment of folders for storing various types of data. Remember, "PersonalDict" is always the locations to save any .txt formatted personal dictionaries so they appear on your device. Any other available folders will contain the saved material from My Word List, the Phone book and other features.

9.4 Backing Up Your Data

While your device is connected to your PC, copy any or all of the folders and then paste them to a location on your PC where you want to save them.

9.5 Restoring Your Data

If you accidentally erase information or it is lost while replacing the batteries, you can restore your data by connecting your device to your PC. Next, find the location on your PC where you saved a backup copy of your information. Copy the information and then paste them in the window containing your device's folders. You can then re-access your previously saved information.
